District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for September 2017

#### **EMERGENCY ACTIVITY**

- 1. Station 15 South Bay responded to 132 calls in September, including 79 Medical Aids; 13 incidents were reported as Traffic Collision; seven incidents were reported as Fire, 23 as Public Service Assists.
- 2. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies in the month of September a total of 3 times.

#### SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 3. During the month of September, Staff continued preparations for the upcoming Fire Safety Fair that is scheduled to take place on Saturday, October 7 from 11am-3pm in the Rite-Aid Parking Lot. This annual event includes tours of the Fire Engines, a true-to-life training in the SLO County Firehouse that teaches children to get low, get out and call for help when they see smoke indoors, demonstrations by SLO Ambulance, SLO County Sheriff's Office and the Los Osos Focus Group. In addition, Station 15 South Bay will demonstrate auto extrication techniques using the jaws of life and children can try their hand at our Extinguisher Flash Pan booth or conduct a cliff rescue to save a teddy bear. Come out and meet Smokey Bear and participate in our Stamp Station Game for free homemade baked treats.
- 4. During the month of September, Station 15 South Bay, in cooperation with KSBY Television and the San Luis Obispo County Firefighters Benevolent Association continued the Operation Santa Claus and the Season of Hope charity events, providing unwrapped presents to needy children under the care of San Luis Obispo County Child Protective Services and the Season of Hope provides food and toys to local Food Banks and Toy Agencies.
- 5. On September 10, 2017, Station 15 South Bay participated in the Family Fun Fair-Grandparents Luncheon at SBCC presented by the Los Osos Rotary. Kids of all ages had the opportunity to tour the engines and were provided trinkets and candy.

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 6. In September, Station 15 South Bay continued planning for Fire Prevention Week, to be held from October 8-14. The campaign message this year is "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" and is a powerful reminder that fire escape planning saves lives. Included in this campaign is the Burn Relay. This year, on Thursday October 12, Medic Engine 215 will visit elementary schools from Nipomo to Los Osos teaching children about fire safety. At the end of the day, a check will be presented to the Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation of annual donations collected by Reserve Company 15.
- 7. On March 19, 2017, E215 was taken out of service due to an open internal switch valve in the transmission that caused the vehicle to only operate in reverse. Engine 262 from Avila was provided to us at no cost. The engine remained in the shop until September 7, 2017.
- 8. On September 22, 2017, Station 15 South Bay staff hosted a local youth who is interested in joining the fire service for a 24-hour Ride-Along. This young man was able to observe what it's like to live in a firehouse. He also observed firefighters while responding to emergency calls, and participated in daily chores, exercise routines and vehicle checks/maintenance. See attached "thank you" note.
- 9. From September 25-28, 2017, CAL FIRE Executive Assistant Harmony Brown provided support for the California Fire Chiefs Association Annual Conference in Riverside. Fire Chiefs throughout California attend this important conference to share ideas on communication, emergency medical services, emergency management, training and operations.
- 10. On September 30, 2017, Station 15 South Bay Staff attended the Baywood Art Show & Lighted Boat Parade. Local artist, Ted Emrick (Emrick Studios) with the support of Paul Irving (Big, Big SLO) bestowed an amazing award to Station 15 South Bay. As stated in their presentation, the award is "in gratitude of your consistent, excellent service. It's a custom glass sculpture from the Emrick Studio and will serve as a constant reminder to all of you for your commitment & amazing service to Los Osos/Baywood." We are honored and humbled by this beautiful gift that is now on display in our Day Room.

#### FIRE PREVENTION

11. On September 18, 2017, Station 15 – South Bay Staff provided two separate tours to Kindergarten classes from Baywood Elementary, including a demonstration of structure fire gear and a chance to climb around in the cab of the Fire Engine. At the conclusion, all the kids went home with a sticker badge and other trinkets.
