District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for November 2016

EMERGENCY ACTIVITY

1. Station 15 - South Bay responded to 102 calls in November with 8 Simultaneous Calls (Back to Back). Two of the Simultaneous Calls required Advanced Life Support (1st: 1, 2nd: 1, Both: 0). Of these 102 incidents, 72 were Medical Calls with 34 requiring Advanced Life Support provided by Paramedics; A CAL FIRE Firefighter rode in to the hospital with SLO Ambulance three times during the month of November. Two calls required Staging; Five incidents were reported as Traffic Collision; Six incidents were reported as Fire, 19 as Public Service Assists, and five as Emergency.

2. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies in the month of November a total of ten times.

<u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

- 3. After being in Anaheim for 7 months for mechanical and electrical issues, Medic Engine 215 was returned to Station 15, equipped with a custom LED light bar that replaced the defective halogen light bar. While Medic Engine 215 was in the shop, SLO County Medic Engine 212 was assigned to Station 15 South Bay to maintain two vehicles for emergency response.
- 4. On November 7, 2016, the Command Vehicle was taken out of service to have the tires rotated, re-align the front end and to have the front seat re-upholstered.
- 5. On November 9, 2016, Reserve Firefighter Patrick Leonard resigned from Station 15 South Bay Fire to pursue a permanent Firefighter Apparatus Engineer position with CAL FIRE San Benito-Monterey Unit. Patrick was a faithful and valuable team member, who served the community of Los Osos for 3+ years and we wish him the very best in his endeavors.
- 6. On November 26, 2016, Medic Rescue 15 was sent to Perry Ford for check engine activation lights in regards to the transmission temperature and an overdrive censor. Medic Engine 215 was used as a front-line response apparatus until Medic Rescue 15 was returned on November 28, 2016.
- 7. In late November, Battalion Chief Tom McEwen was reassigned to the Dispatch Section of CAL FIRE. Battalion Chief Josh Taylor was assigned to Battalion 1, which includes Station 15 South Bay, where Chief Taylor started his career 26 years ago as an entry-level firefighter. He is honored to serve the Community of Los Osos and excited for the opportunity to partner with the LOCSD Board and the community to continuously improve the Fire Department and its services.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 8. During the month of November, Station 15 South Bay, in cooperation with KSBY Television and the San Luis Obispo County Firefighters Benevolent Association kicked off the Operation Santa Claus and the Season of Hope charity events, providing unwrapped presents to needy children under the care of San Luis Obispo County Child Protective Services and the Season of Hope provides food and toys to local Food Banks and Toy Agencies.
- 9. On November 11, 2016, Station 15 South Bay personnel attended the annual Veteran's Day Service at Los Osos Valley Mortuary.

TRAINING

- 10. From November 1-3, 2016 Fire Captain Paramedic Brendan Coalwell taught a Trench Rescue Operations Course in Los Osos to 24 students from emergency responder agencies throughout California, as well as acted as a 'Train the Trainer'. The course focused on safe entry and removal of patients who are a victim of trench collapse. This class meets all California OSHA Emergency Worker regulations.
- 11. From November 7-10, 2016 Fire Captain Paramedic Brendan Coalwell taught a Surf Rescue Operations Course to approximately 15 students from San Luis Obispo and Monterey Counties emergency responder agencies. Training focused on proper boat operations, ocean and surf rescue techniques, incident personnel and civilian safety during water rescues.
- 12. On November 11, 2016, a Medic Student from Cuesta College conducted a job-shadow behind Station 15 South Bay Fire Apparatus Engineer–Paramedic Teddy Borja throughout an 8-hour day, including observing station duties, crew training and responding to emergency calls.
- 13. On November 21, 2016 Station 15 Staff contacted CAL FIRE Law Enforcement to begin the background investigation process on the nine Reserve Firefighter candidates. This process is conducted prior to a conditional offer of employment and ascertains criminal and civil judgments, and furthermore, ensures that the applicant has an acceptable driving record.

FIRE PREVENTION

- 14. On November 18, 2016, Station 15 South Bay Staff hosted Monarch Elementary School on a Station tour of approximately 62 children (ranging from 7-8 years). Firefighters provided a tour of Medic Engine 15 and Medic Rescue 15, along with basic fire safety tips. In addition, each child was provided with stickers and other trinkets.
- 15. On November 29, 2016, Station 15 South Bay staff held a Hands Only CPR demonstration for the Cub Scouts of Los Osos. This demonstration included about eight 9-year olds and their parents, who had the opportunity to observe and train on CPR mannequins with Paramedics on site for help and support to learn a life-saving skill and assist the Scouts in earning a new badge.
