The Board of Directors may also remove any committee member with or without cause" but remove the qualifications as stated in the draft; and, clarifying that the Alternate Committee Member will vote at Committee meetings when a Member is absent but that in the case of a vacancy that he/she will not automatically be appointed as a Committee Member". Director Ochylski and President Storm will amend the Bylaws as discussed and provide to staff for inclusion in the next agenda packet for adoption at the February 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting. 13.
