### STAFF ACTIVITIES

- Staff has been working with the Auditors to have the first draft of the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Audit completed for the December Board Packet.
- Staff has been working with the Bookkeeper, Auditor and Legal Counsel regarding the transfer of the wastewater liens. This item is presented as Consent Agenda Item 11H.
- Staff has been working on the Bayridge Estates RFP and looking into alternative measures to decommission the septic tanks.
- Admin, Water and Fire staff have been working on the Mid-Year Budget Adjustments.
- Staff has been working with the Ad Hoc Committees on the Weed Abatement Ordinance and the refinancing of the wastewater bond assessments.

#### **DISTRICT WEBSITE**

- California SB929 was signed into law on September 14, 2018 which requires a direct link to the most recent agenda. Streamline, the District's website administrator, has updated our website with the new standard for agendas.
- Staff updated the District website with the County's newest link to their rebate program. We have prepared a billing enclosure with the rebate information, updated Channel 20, and created a lobby rebate flyer to direct residents to the County program (attachments provided).

### LOS OSOS LOW INCOME ASSISTANCE FUND

At this time, eight of the nine applicants' sewer laterals have been completed. All eight applicants have chosen to abandon their septic tanks. The remaining applicant is in the process of getting their permit.

At the Board's request, we have extended the application process to December 31<sup>st</sup>. At this time, I have been contacted by one resident who is making arrangement to meet with Lisa Gonzales to receive assistance in filling out the application. Staff has asked the Community Foundation for an additional \$10,000 to help cover costs.

### PROP 1 GRANT FOR 8TH STREET WELL

There were twenty-five (25) Cities and Districts that submitted projects for the Prop 1 Implementation Grant. Attached is a list of how each project scored. At this time, the IRWM group has not picked the finalists so there is time to move up further on the list while others drop out due to design and environmental timing. Currently, the District ranks #9 on the list.

The State Department of Water Resources has release the Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP) for a 45-day public comment period. One of the issues with the PSP is the reimbursement period. Currently, only invoices dated after November 2019 will be reimbursable. If you start on your project too soon, you will not be reimbursed for those expenses. Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) members will be sending a letter to the State asking for the reimbursement time period to be changed to Spring 2019. We will know if the State reconsiders their time frame when the final PSP is completed and distributed to the County scheduled for December 31, 2018. Once the final guidelines are posted, the County and IRWM will pick the final projects that are eligible for funding. This is a 50/50 grant (50% possible grant funding and 50% contribution from District) and our engineering costs do qualify towards our 50% contribution. We have currently paid MNS Engineering \$46,431.12 and Wallace Group \$21,272 towards 8th Street Well engineering. Construction costs will be approximately \$280,000. When the final PSP is released from the State, staff will update the Board with any guideline changes and the County's final decision on grant awards.



### Funding Available:

- DWR proposes 50% of general implementation funds and 35% of DAC implementation
- This amounts to ~\$3.1 million for our region, based on the MOA with Funding Area partners.

### Grant Award Timing (mid to late 2019):

- Application submittal dates vary by Funding Area.
- I expect our application to be due Sept. 2019.

### Local Cost Share:

- 50% of total proposal cost being paid by for with non-State funds.
- Costs incurred after January 1st, 2015 can be used for local cost share
- Waived or partially reduced for projects/proposals that directly benefits DACs

### Reimbursement Eligibility:

- The "funding award date" as the date reimbursements will start.
- For the Central Coast Funding Area, this roughly points to Nov. 2019.

### Agreement Requirements:

- CEQA and Construction permits must be complete by the Agreement, est. March 2020.
  - o If not, project will be dropped from the application by DWR.
  - This may be waived for DACs.

<sup>\*</sup> Note: these are the best estimated times for our Funding Area's workshop, application and award.
