District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for September and October 2018

EMERGENCY ACTIVITY

- Station 15 South Bay responded to 112 calls between August 23-September 20, including 74
 Medical Aids and 5 Traffic Collisions; 8 incidents were reported as Fire, 2 as Hazardous; 10 as
 Public Service Assists. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies
 7 times between August 23-September 20.
- 2. Station 15 South Bay responded to 98 calls between September 21-October 16, including 71 Medical Aids and 3 Traffic Collisions; 3 incidents were reported as Fire, 2 as Hazardous; 14 as Public Service Assists. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies 5 times between September 21-October 16.

ADMINISTRATION

3. On October 10, 2018, Station 15 – South Bay welcomed Carrie Ann Young as the newest member to the Office Staff. Carrie lives in Los Osos, along with her son and other close family members. We are thrilled to have Carrie on our team and are confident that she will be a great asset.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 4. In early September, all six prospective Station 15 South Bay Reserve Firefighter candidates completed the necessary steps to become employees of the LOCSD. We are proud to welcome Reserve Firefighters Chris Hinkle, Luke Kraemer, Alex Rouffaer, Joey Weimer and Andrew Zerolis.
- 5. On September 7, 2018, Station 15 South Bay fire sold Medic Rescue 15 to the Fire Associates of Santa Clara Valley for \$25,000. The funds were deposited in the Vehicle Replacement Fund.
- 6. On September 8, 2018, Station 15 South Bay Staff provided standy-by service at the Baywood Art Show & Lighted Boat Parade

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 7. On September 9, 2018, Station 15 South Bay participated in the Family Fun Fair-Grandparents Luncheon at SBCC presented by the Los Osos Rotary. Kids of all ages had the opportunity to tour the engines and were provided trinkets and candy.
- 8. On September 21, 2018, Station 15 South Bay crew participated in the Monarch Grove Public Safety Day at the Elementary School. This event allowed Firefighters the opportunity to meet a bunch of great kids and talk with them about emergency services and fire safety.
- 9. On October 6, 2018, Station 15 South Bay Staff held their Annual Fire Safety Fair. This year's event was held from 11 am 3 pm in the Rite-Aid Parking Lot and featured tours of the SLO County Fire Safety House, Medic Engine 15 and Sheriff's Dept. D.A.R.E. Viper Vehicle. Firefighters demonstrated the "Jaws of Life" and Extinguisher Flash Pan. Experts taught 'Hands-Only CPR' to the public while emphasizing this valuable skill to parents and their children. Other Emergency Service Agencies and entities, such as SLO County Sheriff's Dept, SLO Sheriff's Search & Rescue and San Luis Ambulance presented interesting displays and vehicles throughout the event. In total, 109 children participated in the Stamp Station Game, which seeks to educate youth on life-saving tips. (see attached news article).
- 10. On October 18, 2018, Station 15 South Bay Fire met with members of Trinity United Methodist Church to do a Safety Walk-Through of their facilities.
- 11. On October 26-27, 2018, Station 15 South Bay crew provided "stand-by service" for the Area 55 event and Los Osos Middle School.
- 12. On October 29, 2018, Station 15 South Bay participated in the Oktoberfest Event in Baywood from 9am-5:30pm and handed out trinkets and met with the community.

FIRE PREVENTION

13. Throughout the month of September, Station 15 – South Bay Staff conducted third and fourth inspections on the 23 violations that remained. Following the fourth inspection, two properties were found to be non-compliant and their information has been turned over to CAL FIRE Law Enforcement for follow-up.
